Cricklewood Coffee's can-brew attitude


James Colbourne is the friendly face who provides a fantastic taste, as he is the founder of Cricklewood Coffee who were formerly based outside Cricklewood train station.

Protective walkways installed at junction

Our programme of highways improvement works is continuing at the Cricklewood Lane / A5 Cricklewood Broadway / Chichele Road junction.

During these works it has been necessary to temporarily close footpaths. But as of this month, protective walkways have been installed to maintain the most direct route for pedestrians.

Rail station continues

Work on Brent Cross West train station continues to progress successfully. The early phases of creating the Eastern Overbridge has started. This will be installed by Easter, opening to the public when the station does in December 2022. The bridge will provide pedestrian access across this part of the Midland Main Line for the first time since it was built 150 years ago.

And civil engineering work on the slow platform of the new station is also on schedule, ahead of piling work which will allow the structure to be put in place.
