For 17 years she owned and ran the food van Emma's Hot Food And Snacks on Brent Terrace Industrial Estate. She now runs the staff canteen at <u>Brent Cross West station</u>, and spends her weekends running her food van outside the ground of her favourite club Fulham FC. And she absolutely loves it.

Emma told us: "It's the friendliest job in the world. On the industrial estate I knew everyone, and everyone was lovely. When they started building the new station everyone was friendly there as well, and they would come to me too. Eventually they invited me to run their canteen."
