Have your say on the future of Clitterhouse Playing Fields in our public consultation

Clitterhouse Playing Fields is at the heart of our vision for Brent Cross Town, and we need your help to make it one of north London's most significant public parks.

A public consultation has been launched on the future of this 44-acre green space, which is the equivalent size of 22 football pitches. The goal is to provide a wide variety of new sports and play facilities that are accessible to everyone, as well as clear and safe walking routes throughout. But that requires you telling us what you want, as we reinvent it as an area where people can relax and enjoy green spaces, grab a coffee, and meet with friends.

Brent Cross Town's first public artwork

This is the first public artwork in Brent Cross Town, a mural which mixes colour, inclusion, local history, and community spirit.

Designed by artist Annu Kilpeläinen, it pays homage to 19th century local botanist William Cattley. Local people were asked what they wanted before the work was commissioned.




Join the team at our Visitor Pavilion

Junction works project nearly complete

Our highways improvements are nearly complete at the A5 Cricklewood Broadway junction with Cricklewood Lane and Chichele Road.

Over the last 12 months we have demolished the four-storey building at the corner of Cricklewood Lane and Cricklewood Broadway, widened and realigned the junction with Chichele Road, modernised the signals, renovated the footways, and installed new pedestrian crossings.
