

Brent Cross Cricklewood Transformation Update



Track our progress as Brent Cross West station begins its next phase

We are entering the next stage of creating Brent Cross West station, with the start of works on the station concourse.

Visitors to the site can now see the station taking shape, after structural steelwork was completed on the overbridge during the August bank holiday weekend. Our teams also began lifting in the main floor beams of the concourse, some of which are up to 13.5m in length and weigh up to three tonnes each. And the last parts of the track, known as the 'scissors', were also removed, marking the end of several years of planning, designing and delivering to make way for the new station.




277-mile charity bike ride is no sweat

Highways improvements nearly complete

Our works at the junction of Cricklewood Lane, the A5 Cricklewood Broadway and Chichele Road began in October 2020, and are on course to be completed next month.
