

Brent Cross Cricklewood Transformation Update



How being green is key to the Brent Cross Cricklewood legacy

Leaders from across the world have been discussing sustainability this month, as Glasgow hosts the 2021 United Nations Climate Change Conference, aka COP26.

But sustainability has always been at the heart of the Brent Cross Cricklewood regeneration programme from its design, to how and what we build, to the materials we use.

Set around 50 acres of parks and playing fields, <u>Brent Cross Town</u> is pledged to be a net zero carbon town by 2030 at the latest, with innovations such as having the largest installation of heat pumps in the UK, and by being designed as a 15-minute town where key facilities are within a 15-minute walk of people's homes. We will promote sustainable and environmentally friendly modes of travel, with a new station for Barnet, <u>Brent Cross West</u> which is on track to open at the end of next year.

Introducing the Flourishing Index to ensure our communities thrive

A pioneering new study into collective wellbeing will play a key role in helping us to design Brent Cross Town, and we want you to take part.

The Flourishing Index is being created from a mixture of online surveys, interviews, and anonymous data such as recording usage of local roads and pavements. Eventually it will be used to measure things such as residents' optimism and their self-esteem, which will shape how the new town is designed and managed.



Clitterhouse playing fields consultation ends

Over 200 people took part in our first round of consultation events into the future of Clitterhouse Playing Fields, while 238 people completed our online survey.

The park is 44 acres of green space, or the equivalent of 22 football pitches, and is a key part of our vision for our new park town Brent Cross Town. As well as an online survey, we also held four inperson events at The WorkShop on Claremont Way and at Clitterhouse Farm on Claremont Road.

Work completed at Cricklewood Broadway

Our series of highways improvements is now complete at the A5 Cricklewood Broadway junction with Cricklewood Lane and Chichele Road.

The year-long programme has included widening and re-aligning the junction, demolishing the four-storey building on Cricklewood Lane, and installing both new modernised signals and new controlled pedestrian crossing facilities.
