

#### **Brent Cross Cricklewood Transformation Update**





Have your say on the emerging plans for Clitterhouse Playing Fields

The Brent Cross Town team has revealed the initial plans for the rejuvenation of Clitterhouse Playing Fields with an online exhibition which is now open. Clitterhouse Playing Fields is the 44-acre open green space, which sits at the centre of the new 180-acre, net zero carbon park town, Brent Cross Town. It is being reinvented as an area where people can relax and enjoy the open spaces, grab a coffee, and meet with friends. There will also be a wide variety of new sports and play facilities that are accessible to all, as well as clear and safe walking routes throughout.

Running until **Sunday 27 March** the online exhibition shows how feedback has been incorporated into the designs for the new playing fields from the first round of consultation last year.
