Brent Cross Town sponsors free girls' football coaching

On International Women's Day (Wednesday 8 March), <u>Brent Cross Town</u> announced an exciting partnership with one of London's leading girls' football clubs, <u>Barnet Nightingales</u>. The partnership marks the launch of Barnet Nightingales' Community Training Programme which will inspire a new generation of female football players.

The free community training programme will provide young women and girls in Barnet and wider, with access to 26 weeks of free football training from their home in Friern Barnet, N10.

Daily football classes will run for young women and girls aged 6 to 16 years old, from March until August 2023. It has been made possible by sponsorship from Brent Cross Town, the development at the heart of the Brent Cross Cricklewood regeneration programme, which is being built in partnership with Barnet Council and Related Argent.

The bus routes which are subject to the changes are: 102, 189, 210, 232, 266, 316, 326 and C11. The closing date for comments is Sunday 16 April 2023.

Prayle Grove works to begin from Easter



Construction works on Claremont Road, between Claremont Way and Prayle Grove, will begin Monday 3 April until Friday 9 June 2023 (total of nine weeks).

The construction works are being delivered as part of building Brent Cross Town. The purpose of the works is to install gas, power and water to deliver Plot 12 (Whitefield Estate replacement homes for high rises). To minimise disruption, works begin next week to take advantage of the Easter break.

PB Donoghues site redevelopment scheme approved



A Reserved Matters Application submitted by Chase Homes for the development of the site PB Donoghues site on Claremont Road was unanimously approved on Wednesday by Barnet Council's Strategic Planning Committee.

The approved scheme will deliver residential flats within three buildings, 15% of which will be affordable housing. The scheme will also include energy efficient buildings to achieve a 36% reduction in carbon emissions.
