People were eager to try out the sport and watch professional players on the field, including members of the Baseball and Softball Academies run by Baseball Softball UK, and guests also got a taste of the new American-style BBQ (halal) and sports bar.

The 108 provides world-class training facilities for everyone and has four batting cages which have been provided by the popular American baseball game centre called HitTrax, as well as two throwing lanes and a full-size adult infield.

On Sunday 10 December, the first new mainline station to open in London in over a decade, threw open its doors in Barnet.

Brent Cross West is now open for use, with up to eight Thameslink trains an hour at peak times, and trains connecting central London to Brent Cross in as little as 12 minutes. There is also a public overbridge which is free to access and open 24/7.
