EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

Whether you're ready to get active or looking to try something different, Brent Cross Town has something for everyone this summer.

Claremont Park is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Exploratory Park is open daily from 7am till sunset. The Visitor Pavilion is open daily from 10am to 6pm.

PARKING

We encourage active travel and the use of public transport where possible. Visitors are reminded that parking on nearby residential streets is not permitted, and enforcement patrols are in place. Claremont Way car park is open daily from 7am to 8pm, and the Tilling Road Car Park is open from April to September, 7am to 7pm.

CELEBRATING OUR COMMUNITY

It's official! On Friday 16 May, we marked the completion of Conductor House at Brent Cross Town and the relocation of former residents of the Whitefield Estate to their new homes across the development.

A ribbon was cut by members of the Whitefield Estate resident steering group, who played a key role in championing the voices of their neighbours throughout the relocation process.



Eileen Touil, who cut the ribbon, is one of Whitefield Estate's longest standing former residents who first moved into the area in 1974. **Eileen told us**: "I love my new home, I think it has been designed very well and feels safe and secure. As we're less than a five-minute walk from our previous home, I love that I can still use the same buses and go to the same shops I always do."

This was a special workshop event as part of the London Festival of Architecture which is a month-long celebration of architecture.

DOING OUR PART...A NET ZERO TOWN

We're on a journey to making Brent Cross Town a net zero carbon town by 2030, and that means making a positive contribution to the world we share by the choices we make.

We achieve this through multiple ways, including ensuring all the energy within our control will be 100% renewable (and that's by having one of Europe's largest electric district heating and cooling networks). We're also improving biodiversity in the area by introducing over 500 new trees, with 313 already planted at Claremont Park, alongside 190,000 bulbs, bird nesting boxes, bee posts and insect hotels, and a new pond.

We've also made it easier for people to take journeys by foot, bicycle or public transport via London's newest station, Brent Cross West, as well as new bus and cycling routes. Plus we're designing and building responsibly – did you know that both the Visitor Pavilion and Brent Cross West's eastern entrance have won sustainability awards?

SUPPORTING BARNET CLIMATE ACTION MONTH

As part of Barnet Climate Action Month and with funding from North London Waste Authority, we held our very first Repair Café at The Workshop on Sunday 15 June.

Over 60 people came along on the day bringing everything from alarm clocks to leaf blowers, headphones to sewing machines, hoovers and laptops all being repaired for free. Barnet resident, Angus Ho brought along his bike to be fixed, he said: "I've had a flat tyre and haven't used this bike for almost a year – everything ran very smoothly. An excellent service. I'm happy that it's totally free and I can use my bike again this summer!"

YOUTH IN CONSTRUCTION

In June, a group of twelve inspired young people from across Barnet were welcomed to Brent Cross Town for a careers event. They had the opportunity to meet with leading construction contractors such as BAM and St George, and explore pathways into the industry.

The joint event was organised by Brent Cross Town and Barnet Council, in partnership with BELS (Barnet Education Learning Service) and marked the launch of their new programme called BuildUp. This programme is open to young people in Barnet who face additional barriers to employment and education, including young people leaving the care system, those with experience in the youth justice system, and individuals taking part in supported internships designed to help them transition into the workforce.

One of the young participants, Louis McGuiness, said: "Talking to the contractors gave me so much information into

the different roles and career paths in construction. I had no idea the Brent Cross development was so massive! Everyone was really welcoming, which made me even more excited about starting my placement - especially now that I've received my Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) card which means that I can work on construction sites."

The event was successful, with young people feeling inspired, asking questions and following up with the contractors to secure work placements.

HAVE YOU CONSIDERED A CAREER IN ARCHITECTURE?

Build The Way is a nine-month entry level architecture traineeship providing an alternative and accessible route into a career designing and making buildings, spaces, cities, and communities.

Build The Way offers a number of traineeship placements to young Londoners at a selection of different Architecture Practices in London.

Each trainee is paid London Living Wage for a 32-hour week, with an additional one day a week for their professional practice and to undertake an EPQ at the London School of Architecture.

With no experience-based barriers to application, places are offered to those who can show a passion for design and cities. Applications for the 2025 programme, which starts in October, open this month and you can apply at **Buildtheway.co.uk**

MEET OUR OUR NEWEST RECRUIT

We recently welcomed Ali, a 24 year old local resident who has taken up a Maintenance Technician role at Brent Cross Town, with support from Barnet Council's employment support service, BOOST.

Ali attended school in the local area and is currently studying part-time at college. This opportunity allows him to apply the skills he's learned so far in college to the role, making it a fantastic chance for professional growth. Ali plans to continue learning at college, whilst gaining valuable work experience.

Another successful recruit at Brent Cross Town is 22 year old Gabriel, who is a care leaver and Barnet resident. Gabriel found us with support from Barnet Council's Education Learning Service (BELS) as he was looking for a full-time role in which he could develop and continue to thrive in. We offered 1-2-1 support to discuss and improve his CV before putting him forward for a Day Concierge role with our residential management partners, Rendall and Rittner. Gabriel attended a recruitment day alongside 18 other Barnet residents and secured the job, which he officially started last month.

We've already supported over 750 Barnet residents through employment and skills opportunities, and we are committed to working closely with Barnet Council to ensure that local residents are the first to benefit from a wide variety of opportunities.

VIEW OUR PLANS FOR THE MAIN ENERGY CENTRE

For our March drop-in session, we invited residents to learn more about our plans for the town's future energy centre and heat network, which will be operated by Vattenfall, one of Europe's largest producers and retailers of electricity and heat. Familiar and new residents attended the presentation which concluded with a helpful Q&A session with Vattenfall experts.

ECPZ CONSULTATION OPENS 8 SEPTEMBER

Following an informal consultation led by Barnet Council in March 2025, residents living on the Golders Green Estate, or on Claremont Road, Whitefield Avenue, Marble Drive, Prayle Grove, Amber Grove and Wallcote Avenue will have received letters about the next steps of the upcoming Experimental Controlled Parking Zone (ECPZ).

In August, signage and road markings will be installed ahead of the ECPZ going live in September. There will be a statutory consultation period for the first six months whilst the ECPZ is operational, and you will have the opportunity to share your feedback on the controls during this period. CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As part of the wider Brent Cross Cricklewood programme, we have a variety of contractors working across the development. We're also working to increase capacity on our roads, while making it much easier and safer for pedestrians to get around the area. Works have been carefully planned to minimise disruption.

Below are the current activities happening to build Brent Cross Town.

- The Ashbee, also known as Plot 203 completed in early June and will be welcoming residents over the summer.
- Maple 1 and Maple 2, also known as Plots 13 and 14 are the first apartments which are built to be rented. Plot 13 has completed and welcomed its first residents. Plot 14 is expected to complete by the end of the year.
- **Plot 15** will also offer homes to rent and is due to start construction work later in the summer.
- 3 Copper Square, known as Plot

 is our first office building which
 sits next to Brent Cross West Station
 and will provide space for Sheffield
 Hallam University's London campus.
 Construction has now progressed to the
 12th floor (with two floors remaining to
 the top) using low carbon concrete to
 reduce its environmental impact. The
 external panels have now been installed
 up to the fifth floor and will continue
 into the autumn.

- Groundworks for **Plot 43B**, a second student accommodation building are currently underway and due to complete later this summer. We will then start construction at the beginning of 2026.
- Construction is ongoing at **Plot 25**, which will provide 662 student rooms and is due to be completed late summer, in time for the 2025 academic year.
- Groundworks underneath the future **Plot 22**, which will be a later living building are now complete. The same groundworks will take place at the start of next year for **Plot 23**, a co-living apartment block and **Plot 24**, a market sale building.

TILLING ROAD WORKS

Highway improvement works began at the junction of Tilling Road and Claremont Road on Monday 7 July. Works have been split into two phases to keep traffic flowing and to minimise disruption as much as possible; and include widening the junction, improving the footways and street lighting. Some bus stops on Claremont Road and Tilling Road will be temporarily relocated close to their existing stop.

HENDON WASTE TRANSFER STATION

If you live on Brent Terrace, contractors will have started to prepare for the demolition works of the decommissioned Hendon Waste Transfer Station. The main demolition works are scheduled to begin towards the end of July and completed by the middle of October. We will be monitoring the noise and dust levels throughout the duration of the works.
