ECPZ updates and next steps



In March 2025, we asked for your initial views on proposals for the Experimental Controlled Parking Zone (ECPZ). Based on the feedback, which the project team have carefully reviewed, we will be implementing the ECPZ in the zones included (a list of road names can be found in the button below). You will need to apply for a permit ahead of the ECPZ going live, which we will write to residents and businesses about. Signage will be installed in August, and the ECPZ will be operational from early September.

Co-living at Brent Cross Town



Planning permission has now been granted to deliver Brent Cross Town's first co-living homes (previously referred to as Plot 23). This new co-living building will provide 352 studios that have multiple amenities, and will be located near the town centre, Neighbourhood Square. There will also be homes available exclusively to support local care-leavers at a more affordable rent level. The community is already taking shape following the completion of four residential buildings, with 3,000 people expected to move into Brent Cross Town by the end of the year.
