

#### Brent Cross Town's 2025 Community Fund now open!

The <u>Brent Cross Town Community Fund</u> has opened for applications, and this year, the Fund is supporting projects that focus on education, employment and training in Barnet.

Teaming up with Brent Cross Town's official heat network and Main Energy Centre provider, <u>Vattenfall</u>, this year, we are offering a total of £50,000 in grants. Individual grants are being made available between £3,000 and £10,000 for projects based in Barnet which can support the local community with accessing projects that focus on education, skills, employment and training.

Similar to last year, there will be a judging panel with local partners and community leaders to select a shortlist of projects. Residents will then be invited in November to vote for all the Fund recipients from the shortlist via an online poll. Find out more details on the Community Fund and how to apply here.


#### Drop-in to see us

## Update on the experimental CPZ



Over the summer, our parking team has been engaging with residents, schools, doctors' surgery and businesses to address concerns and queries before our target go-live date of September. To ensure there's sufficient time to address queries and align with the Council's new permit system, the proposed implementation of an experimental Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) in your area has now been rescheduled to early December.
