OPENING TIMES

Claremont Park is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Exploratory Park is open daily from 7am till sunset.

The Visitor Pavilion is open daily from 10am to 6pm. Claremont Park toilets are open daily from 10am to 5pm between 1 October and 31 May.

PARKING

We encourage active travel and the use of public transport where possible. Visitors are reminded that parking on nearby residential streets is not permitted, and enforcement patrols are in place.

Claremont Way car park is open daily from 7am to 8pm.

PLAY YOUR PART

HAVE YOUR SAY ON NEW SUPERLOOP BUS ROUTE

Transport for London (TfL) want to hear from you on its proposal to introduce a new Superloop bus route called SL13, which would start from Hendon War Memorial and serve areas including Staples Corner, Brent Cross Shopping Centre, Neasden, through to Ealing Broadway. This consultation also includes changes to the existing E7 superloop bus route, which will extend to The Broadway by Ealing Broadway Station.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES

We're committed to providing meaningful work experiences for all members of the community, as well as removing barriers to employment, and fostering a culture of support and opportunity. Here are some examples of our recent successful internships.



WORK EXPERIENCE AT BRENT CROSS TOWN

Over the summer, we supported work experience programmes for year 10 and year 12 students from Clarion School (previously known as Whitefield School). Students learned about design, architecture, construction and got to visit the offices of our construction project management partner Gardiner & Theobold. They also engaged in a sustainability project to design their very own buildings for Brent Cross Town. The year 12 students also undertook a site tour led by our contractors, Galliford Try, which through the Design Engineer Construct programme, included

the opportunity for them to use VR headsets to imagine building sustainable homes in the future.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENT PLACEMENTS

As our contractors Galliford Try approach completion of our newest apartment buildings, we look back at how it has supported the local community, including through jobs, training, apprenticeships and school engagement.

One programme saw students from Barnet and Southgate College complete year long internships where they dedicated one day each to work at Brent Cross Town, assisting the onsite catering team responsible for preparing and serving meals to hundreds of operatives working. Recognising that both placement participants had Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), the programme was carefully tailored to support their unique learning requirements and to ensure an inclusive and nurturing environment. The interns gained valuable practical skills in a realworld workplace and built confidence through hands-on responsibilities.





COMMUNITY GARDEN PROJECTS

Volunteers from Galliford Try also partnered with Barnet and Southgate College students to transform a kitchen garden and outdoor learning space at Claremont Primary School. The teams constructed benches, workstations, raised garden beds, and planters using recycled materials. Some of the plants were also sourced from the schools' neighbours, Our Yard at Clitterhouse Farm.

In total, 232 volunteer hours were contributed across five days from the teams, and the initiative was supported by charitable donations exceeding £700 and nearly £2,000 in materials.

We're excited to continue seeing the space being used which already has enhanced Claremont Primary School's existing foodbank distribution area every Tuesday. The project created a lasting resource for students to learn about food cultivation and for families to connect through growing and preparing fresh produce. Thank you to everyone who took part in this brilliant project.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

As part of the wider Brent Cross Cricklewood programme, we have a variety of contractors working across the development. We're also working to increase capacity on our roads, while making it much easier and safer for pedestrians to get around the area. Works have been carefully planned to minimise disruption.

Below are the current activities happening to build Brent Cross Town.

- The Maple 1 and The Maple 2, also known as Plot 13 and Plot 14 are the first apartments for the private rental market. Plot 13 has completed and is welcoming its first residents. Plot 14 is expected to complete and open by the end of the year.
- Plot 25, our first student accommodation building providing student rooms has been completed. The opening celebration was held in September and students have begun moving in already.
- Enabling works ahead of the construction of **Plot 15** also began in September.
- **3 Copper Square, known as Plot 1**, is our first office building which sits next to Brent Cross West Station and will be home to Sheffield Hallam University's London campus.

The building has now reached its full height, with internal works underway. The building is on schedule to open to students by the academic year 2026/27.

- Groundworks for Plot 43B, a second student accommodation building, have been completed and the construction of Railway Street, which is west of the future building, will continue until Spring 2026. This will complete ahead of the main building construction to provide its primary access route.
- Groundworks for Plot 22, Brent Cross Town's first retirement living homes are complete. Similar groundworks will take place later this year for Plot 23, a co-living apartment block, and Plot 24, a market sale building.

TILLING ROAD WORKS

Highway improvement works are taking place at the junction of Tilling Road and Claremont Road and are expected to last until the end of the year. Works have been split into two phases to manage the flow of traffic and minimise disruption as much as possible. Barnet Council has received some feedback on traffic congestion caused by the four-way lights which were required for work to be undertaken safely. With works moving into the next phase, traffic will now have three-way lights. Some bus stops on Claremont Road and Tilling Road are temporarily relocated close to their existing stop. There is also now a traffic operator in place from 7am to 7pm everyday currently managing the traffic and signal timings. Keep up to date here at transformingbx.co.uk/tilling-road



WORKING HOURS

Construction work continues across the site, and we do not expect works to be any noisier than usual. The construction site is operational between:

Monday to Friday from 8am to 6pm Saturdays from 8am to 1pm

On weekdays, there will be a half-hour start-up and shutdown period before and after the working hours.

For safety reasons, cranes are required to be assembled and dismantled outside of standard operational hours. Residents will be notified of any out of hours working in advance. Head to transformingbx.co.uk/brent-crosstown for the latest information.

WHITEFIELD ESTATE

Whitefield Estate demolition works began in late summer with the hoarding being put in place to secure the area. Throughout October, teams will be conducting an internal clean out and disconnection of utilities (gas, water and electricity) across all buildings.

The main demolition works will be carried out from late October, through to December. This will be done through a careful demolition process starting from top to bottom, by using a long reach excavator. We expect that the programme of works will be complete by February 2026.

We aim to minimise disruption, and continually monitor noise and air levels, however some of the works can be particularly noisy at times due to the nature of the works.
