

# **NEIGHBOURHOOD SQUARE IS NOW OPEN**

Have you seen our striking new fountain and enjoyed Neighbourhood Square? On Thursday, 23 October, the local community gathered to mark the grand opening of this space which sits at the heart of Brent Cross Town and will form part of the new high street. You can't miss The Fountain at the centre of the square, a vibrant new art installation inspired by European piazzas.

Mayor of Barnet, Councillor Danny Rich, Morwenna Hall, Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer at Related Argent and Mark Nixon from NEON who designed The Fountain, led a lively countdown to the inaugural water display, followed by fireworks which lit up the skyline.

Across the neighbourhood the soulful harmonies of the BIG Gospel Choir and the Big Smoke Brass Band rang out whilst warming refreshments were served.






### **COMMUNITY PORTRAIT EXHIBITION**

#### **EVENTS AT BRENT CROSS TOWN**

In 2025, we hosted 96 events and activities for the community. The Spring programme saw over 500 children participate during the holidays, while Summer in the Park attracted over 1,000 visitors. Highlights included the Kiddies Carnival, Family Picnic and Local Legacy evening.

We also helped launch some fantastic new community initiatives such as the Yardbirds Community Choir, which meets weekly at the Visitor Pavilion during term time, and a women's running club that meets on Thursday mornings and Monday evenings. These programmes are designed to support wellness, creativity, and community engagement throughout the year. We look forward to bringing you more exciting events next year

#### BRENT CROSS TOWN COMMUNITY FUND: VOTING OPENS SOON

This year, we've partnered with our heat network and Main Energy Centre provider, Vattenfall, to offer a total of £50,000 available in grants between £3,000 and £10,000 for projects across Barnet. Supporting career pathways can strengthen our community and this year, the Brent Cross Town Community Fund is seeking to support projects that focus on education, employment and training.

It has been our biggest year to date with over 90 applications received! We've curated an expert judging panel who are currently reviewing the applications. Once a shortlist is announced, you will be able to vote for your favourite projects helping us decide which initiatives will be awarded funding.

Voting will open on **Thursday 20 November** and close at midnight on **Thursday 4 December**.

# **CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

As part of the wider Brent Cross Cricklewood programme, we have a variety of contractors working across the development. We're also working to increase capacity on our roads, while making it much easier and safer for pedestrians to get around the area. Works have been carefully planned to minimise disruption.

Below are the current activities happening to build Brent Cross Town.

- The Maple 1 and The Maple 2, also known as Plot 13 and Plot 14 are the first apartments for the private rental market. Plot 13 is welcoming its first residents and Plot 14 is expected to open before the end of the year.
- Plot 15, a combined private rental and affordable building which started construction in September (groundworks and foundation works), will be under construction for the next two years.
- 3 Copper Square, known as Plot 1, is our first office building which sits next to Brent
  Cross West Station. Half of the building has been let to Sheffield Hallam University to
  open their London campus. Internal works are well underway, and we are excited to
  welcome students for the academic year 2026/27.
- Groundworks for Plot 43B, the second student accommodation building, are now
  complete. Construction of Railway Street, located west of the accommodation, will
  continue until Spring 2026. This street will be finished before the main accommodation
  building works begin as it will provide the primary access route. The building itself is
  expected to take around two years to

complete.

- Groundworks for Plot 22, Brent Cross Town's first retirement living homes are complete.
- Construction of the northern section of Railway Street, located near Brent Cross West Station will begin shortly. This work will take place ahead of preparatory works for the Main Energy Centre (MEC), which will be built adjacent to the existing substation. See map for locations.

#### **TILLING ROAD WORKS**

Highway improvement works are taking place at the junction of Tilling Road and Claremont Road to deliver essential improvements to the footways and street lighting. These works are expected to last until the end of the year and have been split into two phases to keep traffic flowing and to minimise disruption as much as possible. From Monday 1 December to Thursday 11 December carriageway resurfacing works will be taking place only at night, with affected roads being closed from 8.30pm to 5.30am. Diversions will be put in place during those hours. Keep up to date here at transformingbx.co.uk/tilling-road





#### **WORKING HOURS**

Construction work continues across the site, and we do not expect works to be any noisier than usual. The construction site is operational between:

#### Monday to Friday from 8am to 6pm Saturdays from 8am to 1pm

On weekdays, there will be a half-hour start-up and shutdown period before and after the working hours.

All construction activity will stop during the Christmas shut down period from 24 December to 2 January 2026.

For safety reasons, cranes are required to be assembled and dismantled outside of standard operational hours. Residents will be notified of any out of hours working in advance. For the latest information, head to transformingbx.co.uk/brent-cross-town.

# CLITTERHOUSE PLAYING FIELDS UPDATE

Planning Permission for the detailed design of Clitterhouse Playing Fields was granted in November 2023. We are proposing some minor amendments and will therefore be submitting an application to update the approved design. The changes will include some minor adjustments to ground levels; the introduction of more rain gardens to improve biodiversity (and reduce the use of plastic tanks below ground); simplification of the path network to reduce tarmacked areas: replacement of tegball with table tennis and alterations to some of the playground areas. We aim to submit the amended design to Barnet Council by the end of November, and it will be available online for review on Barnet Council's planning portal. We will write to residents when we have a confirmed start date for the works.

#### WHITEFIELD ESTATE

The main Whitefield Estate demolition works have begun, working from top to bottom using a long reach excavator. We expect that the programme of works will be complete by February 2026. We aim to minimise disruption, and continually monitor noise and air levels, however some of the works can be particularly noisy at times due to the nature of the works.

### **OPENING HOURS**

Claremont Park is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and the Exploratory Park is open daily from 7am till sunset. The Visitor Pavilion is open every day from 10am to 6pm, and the team are always available to answer your questions and queries and provide an update on what is happening at Brent Cross Town. The Visitor Pavilion will be open on Christmas Eve from 10am to 4pm and will close between Thursday 25 December until Friday 2 January, reopening on Saturday 3 January.
