Whitefield Avenue and Claremont Way



Works are underway on the next phase of development at Brent Cross Town, between the former Whitefield Estate and the Claremont Way area. This next stage will bring improved public spaces and new amenities for the community to enjoy. As part of these improvements, the Exploratory Park is now permanently closed and the play equipment will be relocated to Clitterhouse Playing Fields later in the year. The parade of shops will close on Wednesday 24 June, with Karma Bakery and AFG Food relocating within Brent Cross Town. Whitefield Avenue will also re-open around that time once road improvements and a new temporary car park are complete. There'll also be a new ball court opening adjacent to the car park.
